## What have we done in your area?

We provide a range of services for residents and businesses in your area - from emptying bins, cleaning the streets and dealing with planning applications, to supporting businesses, preventing homelessness and supporting community groups. Here are some of the things we've done and some of the money we've invested in your ward during the last three years:

- Worked with the NHS, Public Health England and others to respond to the coronavirus pandemic and keep people safe.
- Allocated £15,292 of New
  Homes Bonus to Elmley Castle,
  Bricklehampton and Netherton
  parish, £6,779 to Great Comberton
  parish, £16,320 to Hinton and
  Aston Sommerville parish, £6,278
  to Little Comberton parish and
  £17,532 to Sedgeberrow parish.
  This funding has contributed to
  a range of community projects
  including village hall improvements,
  traffic calming, play equipment, a
  marquee and a community garden.
- Awarded £4,000 of community grants to Elmley Castle Scout Group and Great Comberton village hall.
- Invested £96,000 to help attract almost £1.8 million of European grant support to businesses across Wychavon contributing to job creation and increased productivity.

- Helped two small or medium sized businesses to take on new apprentices.
- Inspected 1,232 metres of watercourses to help prevent flooding.
- 28 visits from the Youth Bus.
- Listed The Queen Elizabeth at Elmley Castle as an asset of community value.
- Run 23 sports and physical activity sessions.
